» AREAS

Nature conservation, protected species, nature data management system OAK, public information

» PROJECT TARGETS

The aim of the project is to improve the management of endangered species, including improving the quality and quantity of data on the occurrence of species; drawing up a new list of endangered species (Red Books) and a new list of protected species on the basis of scientific criteria, and raising awareness and active involvement of stakeholders and the general public in the practical protection of the species.

» PLANNED RESULTS

drawing up a list of endangered species on the basis of the criteria of the International Union for the Conservation of Natural Resources (IUCN) and using the latest available data;

to produce data sheets for each threatened species with a brief description (scientific information — ecology, spreading, threat, etc.) and recommendations on its conservation measures;

drawing up an updated list of protected species for inclusion in legislation;

develop clear criteria and a flexible system for the inclusion or exclusion of endangered species from the list of protected species;

improving the quality and quantity of data and ensuring their continuity in the “Ozols” nature data management system for endangered and protected species;

increasing the capacity of national authorities as well as of experts on species and habitats for dealing with endangered and protected species;

promoting awareness and involvement of stakeholders (e.g. landowners and keepers, national and local authorities, professional NGOs) in the practical protection of species;

raise public awareness of the need for and opportunities for the protection of species by encouraging their involvement in conservation measures.

an updated list of endangered species and an assessment of their degree of vulnerability (at least 800 species) has been carried out in accordance with the criteria developed by the IUCN;

updated list of protected species as draft legislation;

a system of criteria for updating the list of protected species has been developed;

prepared data sheets for each threatened species, both in printed form as the Red Paper and in electronic form, in the form of an Internet site;

updated and updated information on endangered species in the nature data management system “Ozols”;

improved functionality of the nature data management system “Ozola” for the management of data on endangered species.
